



CONSULTING AGREEMENT

This Consulting Agreement is entered into as of July 1, 2001 between Maria Luisa Mabilangan Haley ("Consultant") of Washington, D.C. and the Government of the Republic of the Philippines ("Client"). Client agrees to retain Consultant as an independent contractor to render advisory services on a non-exclusive basis pursuant to the following terms and Consultant accepts such employment under such terms:

1. TERM: The term of this agreement shall be for 1 year, commencing on July 1, 2001 and ending on June 30, 2002. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon sixty (60) days prior written notice to the other, provided the Client shall pay the fees and expenses of Consultant through the date of termination.

2. SERVICES: Client shall render advise and coordinating services for the Client as assigned, provided however that Consultant will not provide any services that would require her to lobby or to be deemed a lobbyist under the laws of the United States, or otherwise violate any applicable law including the Foreign Corrupt Services Act.

3. COMPENSATION: Client shall pay a retainer in U.S. Dollars at the rate of \$180,000 per annum in equal monthly installments. Client shall also reimburse Consultant for reasonable business expenses incurred in rendering services to Client, including business class air travel, upon receipt of Consultant's invoices for such expenses; provided, however, that such expenses shall not exceed \$36,000 during the duration of this Agreement.

4. PLACE OF EMPLOYMENT: Consultant's place of employment shall be in the Washington, D.C. Metropolitan area. Consultant agrees to travel on temporary trips to such other places as may be required but shall not be required to relocate without the consent of both parties.

5. INDEMNIFICATION:

A. If Consultant is a party or is threatened to be made a party to or is involved in any action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative (hereinafter a "proceeding"), by reason of the fact that she, or a person of whom she is the legal representative, is or was an agent or representative of, or was acting within the scope of her employment for Client, whether the basis of such proceedings is alleged action or inaction in an official capacity or in any other capacity while so serving, Consultant shall be indemnified and held harmless by Client to the fullest extent permitted by the law, against all costs, charges, expenses, liabilities and losses (including attorneys' fees, judgments, fines or penalties and amounts paid or to be paid in settlement) reasonably incurred or suffered by her in connection therewith, and such indemnification shall continue even though she has ceased to serve in such capacity.

B. To the extent that Consultant is by reason of such position, or a position with another entity at the request of Client, a witness in any action, suit or proceeding, she shall be indemnified against all costs and expenses actually and reasonably incurred by her or on her behalf in connection therewith.

C. All costs of indemnification shall not be in addition to the expenses provided for in



paragraph 3 above.

6. MISCELLANEOUS:

- A. This agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the District of Columbia without regard to any otherwise applicable conflict of laws principles.
